Fruit of the Spirit – Gal 5:22-23 (Strongs definitions)

- LOVE From agapao; love, i.e. Affection or benevolence; specially a love-feast.
- JOY Joy, gladness, a source of joy. From chairo; cheerfulness, i.e. Calm delight.
- PEACE Probably from a primary verb eiro; peace; by implication, prosperity.
- PATIENCE Patience, forbearance, longsuffering. From the same as makrothumos; longanimity, i.e. forbearance or fortitude.
- KINDNESS Goodness, uprightness, kindness, gentleness. From chrestos; usefulness, i.e. Morally, excellence.
- GOODNESS From agathos; goodness, i.e. Virtue or beneficence.
- FAITHFULNESS Faith, belief, trust, confidence; fidelity, faithfulness.
- GENTLENESS Mildness, gentleness. From praus; mildness, i.e. humility.
- SELF-CONTROL Self-mastery, self-restraint, self-control, continence. From egkrates; self-control.

AGAINST SUCH THINGS THERE IS NO LAW

LAW From a primary nemo; law, genitive case, specially, (including the volume); also of the Gospel), or figuratively.

A comment: Holy Spirit Fruit is not a result of the effort of man but is an unconscious byproduct produced by ongoing CONNECTION to Holy Spirit.
